Aim for the higher level questions (Levels 3 and 4)

Example of a higher level thinking question: WHY WOULD the character make that decision?

How to use the Question Chart:

- 1. Select a word from the left hand column of the Q-chart
- 2. Select a word from the upper row of the Q-chart The axis provides the question starting words
