Summary of key CODE work and other Ontario Subject Associations since March 2020

Currently:

- Working for OCT revising/editing AQs in both Drama and Dance. Our sister subject associations are doing similar work in many subject areas.
- Focusing on Culturally Relevant and Reflective Pedagogy, and the decolonization of our resources and our teaching practices with the development of new resources, ensuring that we include resources written in French to add to our existing resources for French Immersion teachers that we began posting slowly over the past couple of years.
- Three members of our Board are delivering a summer institute "Embedding Process Drama in French as a Second Language Context: Exploring Authentic Communication,"
- Two Board members are working with Prologue to the Performing Arts on a grant we
 received together from the Trillium Foundation to work with artists and arts teachers in
 the Algoma DSB, focusing on Sault Ste. Marie and surrounding smaller towns.

Recently:

- Contributed a Dance and a Drama writer to the elementary "Big Ideas" project spearheaded by the Ministry of Education and administered by the other CODE (The Council of Ontario Directors of Education....25 years younger as an organization than our CODE). This document will be released soon.
- Consulted with Indigenous and Black members about AQ Guidelines and best practices for addressing anti-black racism in drama and dance classrooms
- Completed a five year review of all our online resources, identified those which needed
 to be revised, rewritten, or permanently removed and archived, and informed teachers
 about those resources that, while they remained online with wonderful drama and dance
 lesson ideas, needed deeper awareness of avoiding cultural appropriation and/or critical
 thinking about gender, race, culture, orientation, mental health and other relevant
 important areas of focus, and would be revised in these areas as soon as possible.

In the past year and a half, CODE has created and/or shared:

- Resources for parents
- COVID -adapted resources for both online and classroom distanced learning
- Comprehensive overview document August 2020
- Webinars: Dance In The Virtual World; CODE Fireside Chats; Making Sense of Stories Through Drama" and Playwriting
- Videos: CODE Conversations; Addressing Anti-Black Racism in the Dance and Drama Classroom
- Online AGM October 2020
- Online Tribute to Dr. David Booth October 2020

- Online launch of our 50th anniversary celebration year in October 2020 which will culminate in October 2021 with a one day virtual conference
- Feedback to OCT in the creation of new AQ courses, new policies, and specific issues and concerns whenever asked to do so. We take your work very seriously and support it fully.
